Magerkurth of California and the Secretary General Stephen A. Leishman of Delaware. Attending, in addition to Compatriots Magerkurth and Leishman, were several other national officers and representatives from several state societies, including Vice President General Jim Maples of Alabama and SAR Foundation Fundraiser Sam Powell of North Carolina.

For the past two years, Compatriot **Matt Murfree III** of Stones River Chapter has undertaken leadership to raise funds and oversee renovation of the COL Hardy Murfree graveyard in Franklin. The Tennessee Society SAR Board of Governors approved a model program that enabled Compatriot Murfree to raise funds by offering tax deductible donations because of the TNS SAR non-profit status, so that the Society could, in turn, pay for the renovations to the monuments and fencing surrounding the historic cemetery. A historical marker approved by the Tennessee Historical Commission was also erected.

During the training sessions officers will be able to ask questions of experienced former officers with a goal of helping chapter officers feel better equipped to carry out their responsibilities to their members, and also to learn how they fit into the state and national operations. Short-cuts learned here will be very beneficial.

Tennessee Society SAR Board of Governors adopts Constitution and By-laws changes, and new District Map

In order to plan for a future that includes more than 1,000 members, the Board of Governors took action at it's meeting on January 7, 2012, that will have a long-term effect on how the Tennessee Society SAR is administered in the future. Ten years ago, TNSSAR had about 500 members and a dozen chapters. By comparison, by March 2012, TNSSAR will have more than 1,200 members and 21 chapters, with three additional chapters in various stages of planning. It takes a lot of manpower to administer our organization that is spread across one of the longest states in the nation. Accordingly, chapter registrars will be helped by the creation of a state Genealogist who will be a resource to answer questions and to give minor assistance when registrar's need a second opinion on the accuracy of research submitted in an application. This changes lightens the burden on the state Registrar who has until now, handled both responsibilities.

To be implemented in 2013-14, the role of the Secretary will be divided in two—a Corresponding Secretary and a Membership Secretary and the office of VP-Data Management has been combined with this job.

Furthermore, the state has been divided into six districts rather than three. This will make interaction with chapters in the districts much more manageable for the District Directors who will work to implement the goals and objectives of the President and Board of Trustees. Highlights of these changes are included below:

RESOLUTION

Be it hereby resolved that Article IV – Officers of the Tennessee Society SAR Constitution be deleted in its entirety and the following be inserted in lieu thereof:

The officers of the Society shall be a President, a President-Elect, a Vice President, a Treasurer, a Recording Secretary, a Membership Secretary, a Registrar, a Genealogist, a Chancellor, a Chaplain, a Chaplain Emeritus, a Surgeon, a Historian, a National Trustee, and one District Director for each of the six (6) Districts of the State of Tennessee. Such officers shall serve without compensation in such capacities.

Nominees for the officers of the Society [except District Directors] shall be submitted by the Nominating Committee to the Recording Secretary for publication at least 30 days prior to the Annual Meeting. The District Directors shall be elected by the Presidents of the Local Chapters within their district prior to installation of officers at the Annual Meeting and shall take the oath of office with the other General Officers. The Nominating Committee shall be responsible for coordinating elections for District Directors.

The six (6) Districts of the Society shall be as follows:

District 1 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Carter, Cocke, Grainger, Greene, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins, Jefferson, Johnson, Sullivan, Union, and Washington.

District 2 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Anderson, Blount, Campbell, Claiborne, Clay, Cumberland, DeKalb, Fentress, Jackson, Knox, Loudon, Morgan, Overton, Pickett, Putnam, Roane, Scott, Sevier, Smith Union, and White.


District 3 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Bradley, Bledsoe, Hamilton, Marion, McMinn, Meigs, Monroe, Polk, Rhea, and Sequatchie.

District 4 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Bedford, Cannon, Coffee, Franklin, Giles, Grundy, Lawrence, Lewis, Lincoln, Marshall, Maury, Moore, Rutherford, Van Buren, Warren, Wayne, Williamson, Wilson.

District 5 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Hickman, Houston, Humphries, Montgomery, Perry, Robertson, Stewart, Sumner, and Trousdale.

District 6 shall be composed of the following counties of Tennessee: Benton, Carroll, Chester, Crockett, Decatur, Dyer, Fayette, Gibson, Hardeman, Hardin, Haywood, Henderson, Henry, Lake, Lauderdale, Madison, McNairy, Obion, Shelby, Tipton, and Weakley.

A member shall be presumed to be a resident of the District in which the headquarters of the Local Chapter in which he holds his primary membership is located.



There will be a Board of Governors composed of the elected officers of this Society, Committee chairmen appointed by the President, six (6) District Directors, the President of each Local Chapter, and all living former State Presidents who continue as members in good standing of this Society. Members of the Board serve without compensation.

In the event of a vacancy in the offices of President, President-Elect, or Vice President, or disability of the person filling the office, the Board of Governors, at its next meeting, shall elect a successor who shall serve out the unexpired term and until his successor is duly elected and qualified.

In an emergency the President, in consultation with select members of the Board of Governors, shall have the authority and power to temporarily

designate a successor Acting President-Elect and/or Acting Vice President. Such designation and appointment shall be in effect only until the next Board of Governors meeting, at which time the Board will elect a President-Elect and/or a Vice President.

In the event of a vacancy in any of the offices of the Treasurer, the Recording Secretary, the Membership Secretary, or the Registrar, or disability of the person filling the office, a successor shall be elected by the Board of Governors at its next meeting. Each successor so elected shall serve out the unexpired term and until his successor is duly elected and qualified,

In the event of a vacancy in the offices of Chancellor, Chaplain, Chaplain Emeritus, Surgeon, Historian, or Genealogist, or disability of the person filling the office, the State President shall designate a successor to serve out the unexpired term and until his successor is duly elected and qualified.

Non-elective Office: Executive Secretary

There may be an Executive Secretary, an employee of the State Society, who may or may not be eligible for membership in the National Society, Sons of the American Revolution as set forth in the Constitution of that Society. The Executive Secretary, if not a member of the National Society, shall have no voting rights in any matter requiring a vote by the Board of Governors and/or the membership.

The Board of Governors has ultimate authority, responsibility and control, including setting the salary of the Executive Secretary.

Be it hereby resolved that Article VI I - Election of Officers and Delegates of the Tennessee Society SAR Constitution be amended in the following particulars only:

Add to the second sentence "The Nominating Committee shall consist of three members who shall be the".

Delete the fourth sentence "The committee shall consist of at least one member from each of the Grand Divisions (Regions) of the State of Tennessee".

Be it hereby resolved that Article III - Fees and Dues of the Tennessee Society SAR By-laws be amended in the following particulars only;

In Section 2 delete the words "Vice President for Data Management", wherever they appear, and insert in lieu thereof the words "Membership Secretary".

Be it hereby resolved that Article VI - Duties of Officers and Committees of the Tennessee Society SAR By-laws be amended in the following particulars only;

(1) Under the heading President, in section 1 replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Recording Secretary".

(2) Under the heading President-Elect, add the words "The President-Elect shall serve as chairman of the Membership and Extension Committee."

(3) Following the topic headed President-Elect, insert the following new office:

Vice President: Shall perform duties as assigned by the President, and coordinate with the District Directors the planning and implementation of the goals and programs of the State Society.

Delete: "Three Vice Presidents shall be designated Vice President East Tennessee, Vice President Middle Tennessee and Vice President West Tennessee,"

Add: There shall be a District Director for each of the six districts as described in Article IV – Officers, of the Constitution.

(4) Replace the current heading District/Region Vice President with the new heading District Director.

(5) Under the new heading District Director, delete the opening sentence in its entirety, and insert in lieu thereof the following new sentence: Six Directors shall be designated Director District 1, Director District 2, Director District 3, Director District 4, Director District 5 and Director District 6, who shall assist the State President in activities in their districts, under the direction and coordination of the Vice President, and shall assist Local Chapters with planning and implementing the goals and programs of the State Society that are regional in nature.

(6) Under the heading Treasurer, in section 10 replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Membership Secretary".

(7) Replace the current heading Secretary with the new heading Recording Secretary.

(8) Following the new heading Recording Secretary, insert the following new offices and their functions:

Membership Secretary: Shall work closely with the Registrar of the State Society in serving as a clearing house of information gathered in the State Society pertaining to memberships in the State Society, including without limitation transmitting new applications to the National Society for approval, assigning State membership numbers, distributing to the appropriate Local Chapter membership certificates received from the National Headquarters, maintaining a roster of all active and inactive members of the State Society, and disseminating membership information to the Recording Secretary, the Local Chapter, or, upon request, any member of the State Society."

Genealogist: Shall perform such genealogical research as may be requested by the State Registrar and provide instructional seminars for Chapter Registrars pertaining to genealogical research and proper completion of applications."

Chaplain Emeritus: Shall perform the duties of the Chaplain in the absence of the Chaplain."

(9) Under the heading Executive Secretary, replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Recording Secretary, Membership Secretary"

(10) Under the heading Historic Sites and Celebrations, in section 2, subsection (d), replace the words "Grand Divisions" with the words "Districts".

(11) Under the heading Honorary Memberships, replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Membership Secretary".

(12) Under the heading Lytle Cemetery Planning Committee, replace the word "four" with the word "seven", and further replace the words "Grand Division" with the word "District".

(13) Under the heading Medals and Awards, replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Membership Secretary".

(14) Under the heading Membership and Extension, replace the word "three" with the word "six". Replace the words "Vice Presidents" with the word "Directors".

(15) Under the heading Nominations, replace the word "Secretary" with the words "Recording Secretary".

(16) Under the heading John Sevier Endowment Fund Committee, replace the words "Grand Divisions" with the word "District."

In all instances in the Constitution or By-laws, the phrase "Regional Vice President(s)" shall be replaced with "District Director(s)".

Implementation of the new organization structure will begin in the year 2012-2013, and will be fully implemented in the year 2013-2014.


